# REPORT OF MEETING HELD 11th SEPTEMBER 2014

# 1. Apologies

Apologies were received from Mrs J Dodd and Mrs J Nickson

# 2. Report of the Last Meeting

The Report of the Meeting held on 24th February 2014 was taken as read and signed by the Chairperson.

# 3. Activities for 2014

a) To receive feedback on activities since the last meeting

### Blackberry picking

The Community Orchard was opened on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> for Blackberry picking. John Dodd reported that he opened up the orchard on both days with 15 residents attending on Saturday and 2 on Sunday. It was agreed that Fruit Picking days needed to be publicised more widely using posters, website, Facebook and Twitter.

Members debated the when the Orchard was opened for fruit picking as it was noted that the date for the plum picking was too late and fruit had already started to drop from the trees. It was suggested that dates for this should be decided nearer the time depending on the fruit available, weather conditions etc.

b) To receive a progress report on activities arranged for Apple Day, 4th October 2014

Mrs Hurd reported that the following items had been confirmed:

Bouncy Castle
Hawkwise Falconry
Highway Spinney Group
Coles Nurseries
Tree Faces – Braunstone Wildlife Group
Apple Produce Competition
Cake Samples
Refreshments

It was noted that there were no volunteers to run the apple crushing, longest apple peel, apple juice samples and information stall. Mr N Brown confirmed that Councillors would organise the apple crushing. Mrs Hurd agreed to contact Mr & Mrs Selvidge to see if they are able to organise the Longest Apple Peel. The apple juice samples and information stalls would be unmanned if no volunteers were available.

c) To consider additional activities / working days for 2014/2015 It was agreed that pruning would need to take place before the next meeting of the Committee in February 2015 and would need to be arranged during the winter months.

Dates for other activities would be considered at the February 2015 meeting.

# 4. <u>Arrangements for permanently opening the Orchard</u>

- To receive correspondence
   A letter was received and noted by members from Mr John Dodd regarding the opening of the Community Orchard
- To receive the resolution of the Policy & Resources Committee (21st August 2014)
  The resolution from the Policy & Resources Committee was received and noted.
  Members discussed the option of opening the Community Orchard to the public.
  Concerns were raised about glass, rubbish etc. in the undergrowth that had no yet been removed and concern over the pond. Committee members were assured that the Town Council were committed to opening the Community Orchard on a permanent basis once any concerns over health and safety had been addressed, entrances cleared and an Action Plan agreed for the ongoing maintenance of the Orchard area. Mr N Brown recommended that the site is opened permanently in the Autumn/Winter months when evenings were dark which may discourage damage to the site.

It was suggested that the brambles running along the side of Franklin Park be cleared back and the rubbish removed and the entrances cleared in preparation for the site being opened permanently. It was agreed that this site was likely to grow back quickly before the site is open to the public. Mr Kennett suggested that this would need to be done in the Spring or Summer months as the ground tended to be very wet in winter months.

- To develop an appropriate Action Plan
   The following initial Action Plan was agreed:
  - 1. To assess the risks
  - 2. Develop an Action Plan to remove or reduce the risks
  - 3. Develop an Management Plan to carry our maintenance of the site, pruning and fruit picking etc.

  There was no other business.
- 6. <u>Termination of the Meeting</u>
  The meeting closed at 8.25pm.


