BACKGROUND INFORMATION



Braunstone Town

Braunstone Parish has an electoral roll of 12,488 and is the most densely populated area in Blaby District and one of the largest parishes in England (494 hectares).

The settlement of Braunstone was mentioned in the Doomsday Book (1068). It remained a small picturesque village with a population of around 200 people until Leicester Corporation purchased its Braunstone Hall estate in 1925.

In 1935 the part of Braunstone on the city side of Braunstone Lane became the North Braunstone Ward of the City of Leicester, and the parish of Braunstone in compensation had part of Lubbesthorpe added to its boundary.

Braunstone's population rose to 6,997 in 1931 and since this time it has expanded as a mainly residential area. Braunstone adopted 'Town' status in 1977. In 1994 planning consent was

granted for the new Thorpe Astley residential development. Other new residential developments which have recently received planning consent include the Thomas Cook and Jones & Shipman sites.

Braunstone Parish is situated south west of the City of Leicester at the M1/M69 Junction 21. Due to its excellent transport links, the area has also attracted some large scale commercial developments including the Meridian Business and Leisure Parks.

These, together with Fosse Park and Grove Farm Triangle Shopping Centres located adjacent to the southern boundary of the Town provide excellent employment and shopping opportunities.







Serving the people of Braunstone Town (inc. Thorpe Astley)

Braunstone Town Council is the parish authority for the Town and provides a wide range of social and recreational facilities, as well as promoting the interests of the town in its representation to other bodies. The Council works in partnership with the larger District Council and County Council to provide and supplement local government services within the town area.

The Town Council has been accredited under the Local Council Awards Scheme' in 2016, which demonstrates that it is representative, in touch with our communities, competent and capable of taking on an enhanced role.

The Council comprises 21 members who are elected every four years. Each year the Council elects from amongst its number the Town Mayor, the Deputy Town Mayor, Leader of the Council and Deputy Leader of the Council.



The full Council meets six times a year. The Council has three standing committees: Policy & Resources, Community Development and Planning & Environment, along with an advisory group - Citizens Advisory Panel.

The Council employs 23 full and part-time staff. The Chief Officer is the Chief Executive & Town Clerk, Darren Tilley, who is responsible for implementing the decisions of the Council and providing independent, objective and professional advice, information and administrative support to the Council.


- 1. to ensure that local services and the environment reach the highest possible standards within the resources available for citizens, visitors and those who work in Braunstone Town and Thorpe Astley;

Wheelchair users and pushchairs are catered for as the Civic Centre is a single story building with easy access to all areas with no steps and wide corridors and doors.



Millfield Hall

The Millfield hall is a large hall available for events and family parties. There is a large stage with stage lighting. Extension blocks for the stage are available. The Millfield Hall is fully air-conditioned. Variable coloured mood lighting.

Council Chamber

Available for smaller family events, conference meeting etc. The room is fitted with air extraction, spot lights and a wooden floor.

Committee Rooms



A selection of rooms are available for meetings or social occasions for smaller groups. All rooms are fully carpeted, curtained and fitted with fans. The Ravenhurst and Winstanley Rooms can be used as one large room or as 2 smaller rooms.

Kitchens

The Council Chamber, Ravenhurst and Millfield Hall have modern fitting kitchens available to hire in conjunction with room hire. Both kitchens have a large cooker, fridge, dishwasher and tea urn. The Civic Centre can also provide hot flasks/cups, tea/coffee etc, bottled water for a modest charge.

Programme of Events

Braunstone Town Council organises a series of events during September to April including bands, quizzes, barn dances, craft fairs, pantomimes plus much more. Local groups and charities organise the events and the Town Council provides the room, tickets and publicity. Net proceeds are donated to the group. Brochures promoting all the events are distributed in August.

Thorpe Astley Community Centre

Thorpe Astley Community Centre is licensed for music, singing and dancing. Guide Dogs, Hearing & Guide Dogs are welcome in all areas of the Community Centre. Wheelchair users and pushchairs are catered for as the Community Centre is a single story building with easy access to all areas with no steps and wide corridors and doors.



The Main Hall

The Main Hall is available for family events, conferences meetings and recreational purposes. The hall has a wooden floor and serving hatch into the kitchen/bar.

These room are fully carpeted and fitted with blinds. A hatch is available into the kitchen from the activity room.
